WHEN SAMUEL NEEDED HELP MOST, YOU WERE THERE

Samuel Barr, 18, was on a dream holiday riding motorbikes on the sand dunes of a remote beach on the north coast of Tasmania.

But a terrible accident quickly turned this young Aussie's dream into his worst nightmare.

Samuel's motorbike slid off a sandy cliff, crashing heavily many metres below. The bike snapped in two from the impact.

Worse still, the teenager's body was broken in seven places through his pelvis and lower back. tongue, there was no doubt that his only hope was specialist care in Melbourne.

Thanks to the generosity of friends like you, Samuel was quickly transferred to a waiting plane at Launceston Airport flown by experienced RFDS pilot Captain Steve Wood.

As a father of a boy of his own, Captain Wood was determined to do everything he could to help young Samuel through his nightmare.

16 months later, Captain Wood still recalls how vulnerable Samuel looked on the stretcher,

"I didn't see the drop-off until I was already over the edge," Samuel recalls. "My dad saw me disappear and knew it wasn't good – he was there in seconds."

Samuel's mum ran to the top of a sand dune to get reception to call 000. But because the family was in such a remote area, there were no ambulances available. Instead, a helicopter took Samuel to Launceston Hospital.

After initial scans showed horrific damage to Samuel's body, including a crushed pelvis, internal bleeding, a deep gash under his chin and a severed his body broken, bruised, and in urgent need of medical attention.

As Samuel was carefully placed on a stretcher and carried on to the aircraft, Captain Wood thought to himself, "this could be my kid", and was deeply thankful for supporters like you who meant he could be there to save Samuel's life.

Working in partnership with the team of professionals on the aircraft, Captain Wood got Samuel safely to Melbourne for the treatment he urgently needed.

He says rescuing Samuel was a real team effort – and that team

included incredible supporters like you, <<First Name>>. Because without your support, Samuel might not be here today.

Samuel is so thankful for friends like you, who made his life-saving flight to Victoria possible.

"When I think back now it's crazy that I could fly all the way from Tasmania to Victoria to receive specialist care simply because people everywhere donate to the Royal Flying Doctor Service," Samuel says.

⁷ Up until my accident I didn't even know the RFDS operated in Tasmania, yet it's been here helping hundreds of people every year for nearly 60 years! I really wish more people knew what a great job the RFDS does.

Now, more than a year later, Samuel is back at work on the farm and fully recovered from his injuries.

Samuel's mum Melissa said that in a time of uncertainty and confusion, she knew she could rely on the Royal Flying Doctor Service – and people like you.

"We will be forever grateful for everyone involved – from the donors who support the RFDS to the paramedics and hospital staff on both ends who gave Samuel the help he needed."

Thank you for your support, which helped Samuel receive life-saving treatment just in time.





YOUR SUPPORT IS HELPING OUR CREW BE THERE FOR PEOPLE IN NEED

hanks to your help, our mental health care service is bringing hope and support to those doing it tough in remote communities.

In March 2019, the Flying Doctor Wellbeing Service launched in Maffra, Welshpool, Port Albert and Loch Sport.

Psychologist Tess Howells, who works as a mental health clinician says it's an exciting new development because "accessing psychological services is near impossible in regional and remote areas".

Tess is there to help those facing issues such as low mood, stress, worry, relationship difficulties, grief and workplace bullying. She recalls one client, a 56-yearold man who was referred by his employer and was going through a marriage breakdown and a lifethreatening illness.

"In the first session he told me that he had never cried in front of anyone in his life and felt so humiliated," Tess says.

"It's really tough and uncomfortable at the beginning for some, but I tell them it's ok – it's human to feel and express these emotions."

Tess has already seen incredible results with her clients.

One of our clients recently said; "I've been trying to find a psychologist in my district for over 12 months. Now I have one here, I'm receiving the "You can't underestimate the power this service has on people's lives."

veryone involved with the RFDS is a valued member of our team – doctors, staff members, volunteers. And, of course, incredible supporters like you!

One of your fellow passionate team members is Erol Nalbantich, who meets Australians on the street every day, and encourages them to join the RFDS family of supporters.

In his work, Erol often chats with people who've been saved by the Flying Doctor.

"We literally meet anywhere between two to five people a day who have been picked up by the Flying Doctor at some point," he shares.

"One story that stuck with me was a truck driver who was picked up on the Nullabor. A wedge tail eagle flew straight into his windscreen. The poor bloke suffered severe facial injuries, multiple fractures, broken ribs, a punctured lung, and the eagle perforated the inside of his eye socket. The Flying Doctor landed in front of him on the highway, flew him down to Adelaide and saved his life."

Supporters like you make incredible stories like these possible. That's why Erol loves talking to the people he meets, and asking them to become donors too.

One donor Erol spoke to shared, "Erol was awesome! Lots of fun, quintessentially Australian, and 150% passionate about the RFDS."

WHY JANICE IS LEAVING THE GIFT OF A LIFETIME

Janice Hill has had a strong connection with the Royal Flying Doctor Service since childhood. But it wasn't until retirement that she had the chance to explore the Outback and see first-hand the difference the Flying Doctor makes for people in remote communities.

As she travelled across vast distances, Janice was struck by the need for reliable, efficient and trusted health services for isolated people.

"It sort of dawned on me, the distance," she says. "It brought home to me what amazing work the Royal Flying Doctor Service has done since the early days."
