

DEAR SUPPORTERS

2016 marks an exciting time for the RFDS in WA, as we approach the launch of our first new base in over 50 years, which will assist us in continuing to provide aero medical and primary health care right across our vast state.

Our sixth base, which is nearing completion in Broome, will ensure we are able to better serve the growing and changing footprint of the population in the north of our state. With operations due to commence from the facilities at the start of March, our Broome based staff members and aircraft have begun moving into the north-west community and we're looking forward to expanding our services to ensure better outcomes for those who require our care.

In addition to the construction of Broome, we've been collaborating with the WA Police Air Wing and CBH Group on sharing remote airstrip information.

Through the CBH Airstrip Survey Program, the RFDS is able to now share regular reports on the condition of remote airstrips with the WA Police Air Wing.

As we wrapped up our 80th anniversary celebrations last year, the iconic Sugar Bird Lady monument was restored and placed back on its plinth on Eagle Drive, Jandakot, following storm damage. This rich part of our history is now back on display opposite our Jandakot base, and we welcome you to read more about it in the article on page 3.

We are very excited about the future of RFDS in WA as we continue to evolve to meet the needs and demands of our patients, and it's due to your ongoing support and continued commitment to our service that we are able to be there whenever and wherever required.

SUGAR BIRD LADY MONUMENT RESTORED >









Nurse and aviator Robin Miller

The historic Sugar Bird Lady monument, a replica of a Mooney Mark 21 aircraft from the 1960's, flown for the RFDS by former nurse and aviator Robin Miller, has been restored and returned to its place on Eagle Drive in Jandakot.

Robin Miller was an innovator, requesting permission to fly to northern WA in order to carry out a vaccination programme. Permission granted, she borrowed money for a Cessna 182 and set out on her first flight on 22 May 1967. The name "Sugar Bird Lady" was given to her by outback Aboriginal children during her work combating polio, travelling to remote communities, she treated children with the Sabin vaccine in sugar lumps.

She completed the immunisation programme in October 1969, after administering over 37,000 doses

of vaccine and flying 43,000 miles (69,200km). She replaced her Cessna with a Mooney Mark 21 and flew regularly for the RFDS, always on call, flying in all types of weather, responding to a range of emergencies and coping with difficult or frightened patients. She was one of the outstanding female pilots of the 20th century, once quoted as saying about her job; "It's difficult to define it. It's always a challenge. You never know what you're going to encounter. In my particular job, you never know where you're going or when or for what."

Sadly, at the age of only 35, Robin died of cancer, in 1975. The Sugar Bird Lady monument was established in her memory and is a well known landmark at Jandakot. Although not the actual aircraft flown by Robin Miller, the engineering prototype donated by Mooney Aircraft to the RFDS in 1978 serves as a memorial to the late Robin Miller.

The aircraft was damaged and blown to the ground in a storm in 2013, but with the assistance of the restoration team at the Aviation Heritage Museum Bull Creek it has been restored, repainted and reinstated to its plinth at Jandakot Airport.

BROOME BASE UPDATE

For the past 12 months, we have been busy planning and building our first new base in WA in over 50 years. Located at the Broome International Airport, the facility is set to bolster our capabilities in the north of the state, with Broome having seen a 236% increase in aero medical patient flights over the past five years.

The new facility will officially open in March and will become the sixth operational RFDS base in Western Australia.

The facility comprises two aircraft hangars, and a patient treatment centre; having transported over 1,100 patients to and from Broome last year alone, these facilities will mean the RFDS is better placed to more quickly respond to emergencies throughout the Kimberley, enabling reduced flight times, and ultimately providing better outcomes for our patients.

BUSSELTON RFDS VOLUNTEER COMMITTEE PROFILE >

The RFDS Busselton Volunteer Committee are a dedicated group of 19 members and 40 helpers, led by committee President Alison Cunningham.

The RFDS Busselton Volunteer Committee are long time supporters of the RFDS and work tirelessly to support us throughout the South West. Their fundraising is undertaken through a variety of activities including raffles, open gardens, donation tins and various events they hold throughout the year including film premiers and fundraising concerts. With the support of the local community, the Busselton volunteers raised over \$52,000 for the Flying Doctor in 2015 – taking their support to over \$720,000 for the RFDS since the committee's inception!




We are excited to introduce 'The Support Crew' this month – the official new Regular Giving Program for the RFDS in WA.

JAKE'S STORY

RFDS PILOT >

Jake Walsh loves his job as a Pilot for the Royal Flying Doctor Service. He has come 'full circle' since being an RFDS patient at the age of two when he inhaled a two cent piece.

"Mum probably wasn't too impressed and Dad was in trouble for allowing me to play with two cent coins, but I was ok after being airlifted from Port Macquarie to Newcastle by the RFDS," he said.

Fast forward 23 years and Jake now has more than nine years' experience flying; the last six months of that with the RFDS. He moved from Port Macquarie to WA and has already seen a fair bit of our vast state while working for various mining companies and now the RFDS.

"It's an exciting job; I get to fly for the RFDS and contribute to saving lives, and no day is ever the same as the next," he said.

Now based in Port Hedland, Jake said he loves not knowing where he will be flying to on any day he's working. "On my first day flying a Pilatus PC-12, we were diverted to Albany to assist with the search for two people who were in the water after their boat had capsized. We managed to locate them in time and they have both recovered, which is great," Jake said.

"The job we do is quite rewarding and I love being part of a team, assisting the doctors and flight nurses."

"Some of the places we travel to for patient retrievals are so remote, you wouldn't even know they existed, like Jamieson Range close to the South Australian and Northern Territory borders. The people there are so far from any medical assistance and they are very relieved to see the RFDS!"

Jake says you need to be able to accustom yourself to a changing environment quite quickly as part of the RFDS team.

"You need to be able to adapt to constantly changing tasks. You might be diverted while in the air and while you can try to plan ahead, things change most of the time." "Some shifts involve flying at night or in bad weather and retrieving patients from serious car accidents. We had one last year in the state's north-west involving 16 people in one vehicle, two didn't make it which is sad but I'm pleased that most did, including an eight year-old girl from Broome who has made a full recovery."

Jake enjoys the RFDS environment and says it's a much bigger team than he'd realised. He enjoys bike riding, swimming and camping and has no plans to move on from the RFDS, hoping at some stage to be based in Kalgoorlie.

WENDY'S STORY >

Karratha Real Estate Agent Wendy Hipworth, 23, had been suffering from bad stomach cramps and pains. When a routine tap dancing class in June last year, resulted in worsening pains, Wendy knew she needed to go to hospital. This trip to the Karratha Hospital proved to be vital, as blood tests revealed Wendy had severe pancreatitis and suspected gall stones.

"During my tap dancing class I noticed the pain getting worse, and when I got home I began trying to vomit," she said. "It was then I called my mum and went to hospital."

After spending the night in emergency, and with plenty of medication to get her through to pain, Wendy's doctor confirmed she had gall stones, and would need surgery, which was too high risk to be performed in Karratha. The Royal Flying Doctor Service was called

and Wendy was on her way to the airstrip within 20 minutes to meet the aircraft and medical team.

Whilst in flight, the aircraft was diverted to collect two more patients who also both required a flight to Perth for further medical assistance. The RFDS Flight Nurse on board looked after the medical needs of all three patients throughout the five and a half hour flight. The three patients were flown to Perth and taken to hospital by ambulance; Wendy was taken to Royal Perth Hospital where she would spend the next 10 days.

"Due to the swelling, they couldn't perform surgery until it subsided, so I spent 10 days in hospital," she recalls. "It's like having a swollen ankle - you can't do much other than rest it, and you have to wait out the pain until it can be operated on."

Wendy fortunately made a full recovery, and the RFDS are well known in Karratha due to the number of retrievals made in and around this remote Pilbara town.

STAY SAFE THIS EASTER >

The Royal Flying Doctor Service is urging all West Australians to take care as they prepare to enjoy the Easter holiday season this month.

While the RFDS team is ready to respond 365 days a year, 24 hours a day, it would be preferable that we were not needed at all over the Easter period, which is traditionally a very busy time, particularly on our roads with many holiday goers travelling from the greater Perth metro area to popular holiday locations around the state.

Unfortunately the holiday periods see more West Australians killed on our roads than almost any other time of the year, and we ask that people be mindful of the road conditions, and the additional care needed when driving long distances.



WA POLICE AIR WING COLLABORATION >

Every day the RFDS accesses airstrips around the state. Through the state-wide Airstrip Survey and Evaluation Program, sponsored by the CBH Group, the condition of almost 750 airstrips are reviewed regularly to ensure they are maintained and safe for aircraft landings.

As many of these remote airstrips are not used regularly, it is important to ensure that they are accessible and safe for us to be able to land on when delivering essential medical care, or evacuating patients from remote locations.

The RFDS are now sharing this regularly updated airstrip information with the WA Police Air Wing who also utilise many of these airstrips around the state. Initiating this collaboration means better outcomes for all people living, working and travelling throughout Western Australia.

The 2015 Steadfast Outback Air Race set off from Esperance on Monday, 24th August and finished in Hamilton Island, QLD on Friday, 4th September. The event consisted of 26 light aircraft piloted by over 70 crew and passengers from all over Australia. The 5,000km GPS-based navigation time trial took participants on a two week fundraising adventure throughout remote outback Australia. The route took in many of Australia's iconic landmarks including Uluru, Alice Springs, then over the Simpson Desert to Birdsville and Winton. It then saw participants fly over the spectacular Gulf Country to Karumba and across to tropical Cooktown, with the final leg being a breathtaking flight down the East coast to the finish line.

The 2015 Steadfast Outback Air Race raised a record \$585,000 for the RFDS nationally, which continues to solidify the event as RFDS WA's largest community fundraising event, having raised over \$2 million since its inception in 1996.
