
It is a fact that many Australians do not have a valid Will.

How do I leave the Flying Doctor with a Gift in my Will?

A gift to Royal Flying Doctor Service (Western Operations)

We recommend that you seek professional advice when preparing or making changes to your Will to ensure that your wishes are clearly and legally stated. If you choose to nominate the RFDS (Western Operations) as a beneficiary in your will, you can choose one of the following options:

To leave a sum of money to the RFDS (Western Operations)

I give to the Royal Flying Doctor Service (Western Operations) ABN: 29 067 077 696 the sum of dollars (\$..........) free from all duties or other taxes, whether State or Federal, to be applied towards or used for the benefit of the Service.

To leave a proportion of your estate to RFDS (Western Operations)

I give to the Royal Flying Doctor Service (Western Operations) ABN: 29 067 077 696 [insert percentage amount] percent of my estate to be applied towards or used for the benefit of the Service.

To leave a residual gift to the RFDS (Western Operations) after specific gifts are written

Robin Miller Flight Nurse and Pilot



A life of service and adventure

Robin's achievements during her short lifetime were remarkable. As a pioneering female pilot who combined her passion for flying with nursing, Robin made many valuable contributions to both aviation and medicine. Robin did it all - a pilot, flying nurse and aircraft engineer with the skills and bravery to retrieve many patients solo!

Robin is best known as the 'Sugar Bird Lady' as she came to be called by Aboriginal communities in WA's remote North West. When a second wave of polio hit Western Australia in the late 1960s, Robin saw a great risk of the disease for people living in remote WA and began an immunisation program, flying to isolated communities to deliver vaccine doses on a sugar cube. Although the Sabin vaccine had been available for a decade, the tyranny of distance in WA had prevented immunisations for those living far from town.

Robin borrowed money to purchase an aircraft especially for this purpose, then became both pilot and nurse to deliver the immunisation program on the ground.

Robin visited about 450 remote towns and communities and flew more than 43,000 miles (69,200 kms) to administer more than 37,000 vaccines.

Robin had a vast knowledge of the North West, having spent a great deal of time living and travelling in the region during her childhood and as an adult.

She worked as a flying nurse at the Royal Flying Doctor Service - Western Australia between 1970 and 1975.

Robin Elizabeth Miller was born in Perth in 1940 to two well-known Western Australians, author and historian Dame Mary Durack and Captain Horrie Miller, a pioneering aviator and co-founder of MacRobertson Miller Airways.

Robin trained as a nurse at Royal Perth Hospital, where she graduated with the State Nurses' Medical Prize in 1962. During her nursing training, Robin also found the time to attain her commercial pilot licence.

After graduating, Robin spent much of her life in the air in the 1960s and 70s. As well as working as a flying nurse, she flew several RFDS aircraft on epic voyages from Europe and the USA back to Western Australia, including a solo journey from Paris to Perth. Robin was also an avid competitor, participating in air races including the All Women's Transcontinental Air Race across the United States, known as the Powder Puff Derby, in 1973.

In the same year, she married Harold Dicks, a director of the Royal Flying Doctor Service.

Robin won several awards including the Nancy Bird Walton Award for Australia's Woman Pilot of the Year, a Diploma of Merit in Italy, the Brabazon Cup from the Women's Pilots' Association of Great Britain and the Paul Tissandier Diploma – Federation Aeronautique Internationale. The last two were awarded posthumously.

Robin passed away in December 1975 aged 35 and was laid to rest in Broome.

Robin's courageous attitude, outstanding achievements and distinguished career continue to inspire people from all walks of life and particularly those in the RFDS. Her legacy lives on in the community health programs that continue to be delivered to remote communities throughout Western Australia.
